Government Levy Summary

Levy Payer:

- Wage bill over £3m
- 0.5% of Wage bill paid into Levy
- Connect with training provider and allocate your levy funding for apprentice
- Training costs = £0
- You pay apprentice salary

(apprentice wage currently set at £5.28ph)

Non-Levy Payer:

- Wage bill under £3m
- Connect with training provider and reserve 95% funding for apprentice
- Training Costs = 5% for exmaple -£4,000 programme, you pay £200
- You pay apprentice salary

(apprentice wage currently set at £5.28ph)
